Father Bohdan delivers his Sermon on Sunday, September 12, 2021

Whatever you love the most, serve most, seek out most, give to the most, worship the most and care about the most is your god. Your "god" can be your career, your bank account, the way you look, a particular position or degree, influence, power, or physical pleasure. Your "god" is whatever you allow to control you, to be the ultimate guide to decision-making, the place of your supreme loyalty, and the source of your self-worth. Jesus showed the young man in today's Bible reading that he was not good enough for God, despite his wealth. Jesus put a light on the sin that separated him from God, and it was the young man's greed and his idolatry with regard to the things he possessed. And Jesus summarized it perfectly with these words: it is easier for a camel to enter the eye of a needle than for a rich man to get into Heaven. AMEN.

Father Bohdan's Sermon Sunday, September 12, 2021

We are all guilty of this: We want Jesus, but on our own terms. We want Jesus to go with us and bless our plans, but only as a part of our lives.

Today's Scripture reading is the story about the rich young ruler who had everything except one thing—an assurance of eternal life. He was not absolutely sure that he was "right with God." And his doubts were justified.


PRIEST: The reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew.


