


"Apostle Thaddeus of the Seventy" on Sunday,
September 3, 2023. This lesser-known Apostle's
story required research which led to an explanation
of the "Seventy." When Apostle Thaddeus (to be
distinguished from Apostle Jude, also called
Thaddeus) arrived in Jerusalem for a feast day, he
heard John the Forerunner preach and was
subsequently baptized by him in the Jordan. Apostle
Thaddeus then saw Jesus and became His follower,
chosen to be one of the Seventy Disciples, early
emissaries of Jesus sent in pairs to preach in the
cities and places where He intended to visit —
as recorded in the Gospel of Luke 10:1-24.

Then He turned to His disciples and said privately, "Blessed are the eyes which see the things you see; for I tell you that many prophets and kings have desired to see what you see, and have not seen it, and to hear what you hear, and have not heard it."

Jesus used parables to enlighten us about God. The parable in Sunday's Scripture reading is "The Parable of the Tenants" or the "Parable of the Patient Landowner." In this story Jesus teaches four truths about God:

NUMBER 1. GOD IS THE OWNER...of everything! Like the landowner in the parable, God is the Creator and He owns all of Earth and beyond. The tenants did not own the vineyard, but they acted as if they did. They wrongly thought: "We don't need God. We control our lives and fate." But the truth is: WE DO NOT OWN ANYTHING. WE ONLY MANAGE GOD'S PROPERTY.

THE SECOND REVELATION IN THE PARABLE IS: GOD IS PATIENT.

The owner of the vineyard sent a messenger to collect what was due him, but the tenants beat him up and kicked him out. But this owner simply sent another servant—and they killed him; he sent another and they stoned him. The lesson here is: God is patient with us. God sends many servants to communicate His will.

THE THIRD TRUTH IS: GOD IS LOVE.


In the parable, after the owner's servants had been rejected and abused, he takes an astonishing step: he sent his only beloved son hoping the tenants would respect his son, and instead they killed him.

AND THE FINAL TRUTH IS: GOD IS JUST.

God is love, and God is patient. He is slow to anger and quick to forgive. His mercies endure forever. But always remember that God is just. That means He will determine perfect justice for all of us in the end. If we learn from Sunday's parable, we will be ready.

MESSAGE FROM CATHEDRAL COUNCIL PRESIDENT: TOM HANNEY



Greetings! I hope everyone is having an enjoyable summer. There's never summer vacation at St. Nicholas Cathedral. It's business as usual, all year round. We are even busier in the summer as that is when the Festival Director, Judy Hanney, and her team, start preparing for our biggest annual fundraiser of the year: the PIEROGI FESTIVAL, this year on Saturday, November 4, and Sunday, November 5.

Published next to this message is the food prep schedule for the Festival. We expect to have dozens of parishioners at every session.

Most of the year we come and go as individuals, with very busy everyday schedules. But at this time of the year, we ask you to perform a Labor of Love for God and your Church. This is about working as a team and having the dedication of a team to succeed. Do this now! Mark it a Priority! Make Saint Nicholas a Priority! Choose as many dates as possible and dedicate yourself to being there for your team.

Showing up when there is work to be done says you are truly a member of Saint Nicholas. Not showing up says you are just a visitor.

The money raised from the Festival will pay the utility bills for the Cathedral and the Rectory. The true cost of operating the Cathedral is approximately \$16,000 per month. If you are unable to put anything in the collection basket, this is the time to contribute to the Cathedral with your labor – and chop onions, steam cabbage, pinch pierogi. And work at the Festival. If you attended Divine Liturgy and find serenity and a heightened spirituality, this is the time to give thanks and work as a team to achieve our financial goal.

13TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

I am glad about the coming of Stephanas, Fortunatus, and Achaicus, for what was lacking on your part they supplied. For they refreshed my spirit and yours. Therefore acknowledge such men. The churches of Asia greet you. Aquila and Priscilla greet you heartily in the Lord, with the church that is in their house. All the brethren greet you. Greet one another with a holy kiss. And he leased it to vinedressers and went into a far country. Now when vintage-time drew near, he sent his servants to the vinedressers, that they might receive its fruit. And the vinedressers took his servants, beat one, killed one, and stoned another. Again he sent other servants, more than the first, and they did likewise to them. Then last of all he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' But when the vinedressers saw the son, they said among themselves, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and seize his inheritance.' So they took him and cast him out of the vineyard and killed him. Therefore, when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those vinedressers? They said to Him, "He will destroy those wicked men miserably, and lease his vineyard to other vinedressers who will render to him the fruits in their seasons." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: 'The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief cornerstone. This was the LORD's doing, And it is marvelous in our eyes'?" (Matthew 21:33-42)
