

We are renting our "south lawn" to Citylight Church on a week-to-week basis. Weather permitting, CLC will hold its worship services Sunday mornings on our grass from 8 am-9:30 am and 11:00 am-12:30 pm. This is a TEMPORARY situation. CLC will stop renting our outdoor space when Philadelphia transitions to the Green Phase. CLC has congregational singing accompanied by a keyboard. Pastor Mike Anderson said he expects up to 50 people to attend each service. Everyone will follow COVID-19 safeguards. (CLC is NOT using our parking lot; the CLC congregation will park on 7th Street.)

Looking ahead at our Church calendar.....our Annual Parish Meeting is scheduled for SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, 2020. A boxed lunch will be served to all attendees. President, Tom Hanney, will lead the meeting. This is your opportunity to hear about our accomplishments this past year and future projects. Members will vote for Council Members. We invite you to ask questions. (You may recall that our semi-annual update meeting scheduled for March 29 was canceled because of the quarantine, so there will be a lot of information to share at the September meeting.)



Father Bohdan's Sermon – Sunday, August 30, 2020 – Dormition of the Holy Theotokos

Last Friday, August 28, was the Feast of the Dormition or Falling Asleep of the Mother of God Theotokos – the assumption of Mary to heaven from earth. This feast commemorates the death, resurrection and glorification of Mary. And it is the custom in the Orthodox church to bless flowers on this day – as we did today. Mary died without illness, peacefully and with every virtue. Her soul was taken up in the divine hands of her Son and carried up into the heavenly kingdom accompanied by the singing of angels. Mary's most pure body was then carried by the apostles to Gethsemane where it was honorably buried, and on the third day it was resurrected and taken up to heaven. You see this event depicted on the icon of the "Dormition of the Theotokos." The body of the Theotokos is surrounded by the apostles and in the center of the icon is the Lord holding in His hands the most pure soul of the Theotokos. The feast of the Dormition is the sign, the guarantee, and the celebration that Mary's fate is the destiny of ALL Christian believers. What happens to Mary happens to all who imitate her holy life of humility, obedience and love. And we forever ask her to intercede on our behalf. AMEN.

13TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

And the vinedressers took his servants, beat one, killed one, and stoned another. Again he sent other servants, more than the first, and they did likewise to them. Then last of all he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' But when the vinedressers saw the son, they said among themselves, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and seize his inheritance.' So they took him and cast him out of the vineyard and killed him. Therefore, when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those vinedressers? They said to Him, "He will destroy those wicked men miserably, and lease his vineyard to other vinedressers who will render to him the fruits in their seasons." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: 'The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief cornerstone. This was the LORD's doing, And it is marvelous in our eyes'?" (Matthew 21:33-42)


