Father Bohdan's Sermon – Sunday, September 1, 2019 – Matthew 18:23~35

Today's Scripture reading is a call for unlimited forgiveness. Jesus illustrates this with a powerful parable. A servant owed his King a lot of money that the servant could not repay. He would be punished and the servant accepted this justice, but pleaded for patience. The King's compassion went one step further, and the King granted the servant undeserved forgiveness. Yet the forgiven servant did not do the same for another who owed him a small amount of money, and the servant was prepared to extort the money through violence and cruelty. When the King learned of this, he said: YOU WICKED SERVANT. I FORGAVE YOU AND YOU CANNOT FORGIVE ANOTHER? OFF TO JAIL WITH YOU! There is nothing that so grieves the Holy Spirit as an unforgiving spirit. We bring torment upon ourselves if we have an unforgiving heart. We are not hurting our brother, but ourselves. Heaven's door is shut upon our bitterness until we repent. And think how many times God has forgiven us.

For that reason alone, we must forgive others to the utmost. AMEN.

This beautiful Saint Susanna icon joins our sacred family of icons in St. Nicholas Church. Saint Susanna was the niece of the Bishop of Rome and related to the Emperor. Saint Susanna was virtuous, beautiful, wealthy and Christian. When she refused to marry a pagan, she was arrested and killed. THE SCRIPTURE READING FOR SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 8 12TH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PRIEST: Let us attend! Peace be unto all!

READER: And to thy spirit.

PRIEST: Wisdom!

READER: Brothers...Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received and in which you stand, by which also you are saved, if you hold fast that word which I preached to you-unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures, and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve. After that He was seen by over five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep. After that He was seen by James, then by all the apostles. Then last of all He was seen by me also, as by one born out of due time. For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me. Therefore, whether it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed. (1 Corinthians 15:1-11)

And again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God. When His disciples heard it, they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?" But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." (Matthew 19:16-26)



This year, due to the success of our Church Hall being booked, we have limited days on which to make our pierogis and roll our helupki. Please note the dates below that are available for our use and mark your calendars. We are locked into them!

- September 27, 28 & 29
- October 4, 5 & 6
- October 18,19 & 20
- October 27
- November 1

Friday evenings, we make the filling for the pierogi, and the start time is 6:00 PM or as soon as you can arrive after work. On Saturdays, the start time is 8:00 AM and we end at approximately 1:00 PM. And on Sundays, we roll, pinch and freeze immediately following Divine Liturgy!

Sunday, October 27, will be for final prep work, such as filling the sour cream and cherry containers (our St. Nicholas Youth did a great job doing this last year), cleaning and setting up sterno dishes, trays, crock pots, etc. Friday, November 1, is for last-minute prep and set up.

We need to make 8,000 pierogis. We need everyone to help! Onions will be available for pick up on September 8. They need to be sautéd and placed in the freezer bags (to be provided). Also, Colleen and I will be steaming cabbage on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 10:00 AM (after rush hour), beginning after Labor Day. We ask those who can to join us! We need to make 1,000 helupki. For those making soups, please pick up your containers. The freezers are ready!:)
